The January Term 1857, after an examination of the above settlement it is approved by the court and ordered to be recorded. And it is further ordered by the court that Messrs. Johnson be allowed the sum of fifty dollars in addition to his fees set apart by law for making and recording this settlement as clerk of the county court; and that the executors pay the same of fifty dollars, and that they receive credit in this settlement for the same.
