 there being nine Negroes, that has come to our hands, and a
 decree of the Circuit Court, to sell said Slaves we have
 laid out said Negroes until the sale can be made. No other
 personal property came to our hands, no lands nor money, which
 is respectfully submitted, 28th July 1850.
