dispos'd by this will be sold at auction on Friday March
2^d & to be divided between all my heirs so that all shall
at my death have an equal part of my estate & him
real & personal executed by proper persons in accordance
with this will & lastly I do hereby ordain and appoint my
William & Calau executors of this my last will and testament
in witness whereof I Henry Sharp the 1st Testator have to this my
will written in two sheets of paper joined together this thirty fifth
day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred
& forty eight signed sealed & published in the presence of us my
two Subscribers in the presence of the testator & each other

Rawle Sarah Rawle Elizabeth Brooks and Jane Estes and
their heirs having hentofore had all that portion of my
estate which I designed for them and earthly as to all
the rest residue and remainder of my personal estate
goods and chattels of what kind and nature soever I
give and bequeath the same to my said beloved wife
Nancy Rawle whom I hereby appoint sole Executrix
of this my last will and testament hereby revoking
all former wills by me made in witness whereof I
have hereunto set my hand and seal this 24th day of May one

Claiborne County & pursuant to the foregoing order of the County Court
of said County and to us directed we the under signed after being
qualified and sworn according to law have proceeded to assign
and layoff to Ann S. Stewell and family their support out of the
crop and provision on hand for one year as prescribed by act of
the General assembly in such cases made and provided to net
six hundred bushels of corn. one hundred lbs of wheat. Seven thousand five
hundred pounds of starch. two thousand lbs of beef. twenty bushels of
salt. three hundred and Sixty pounds of coffee. three hundred and
Sixty pounds of Brown sugar 5 lbs of imported Tea 5 lbs of Spice 5 lbs
of pepper 25 lbs of Lye sugar. Four hundred chicken and what beef &
fodder is on hand it being stipulated to be barley enough for the horses &
cattle allowed by law to the widow. Given under our hands
