Henry Sharp's will.

I Henry Sharp of the county of Delaware & State of Tennessee Placid do make of and last this my last will & testament hereby revoking & making void all former wills by me at any time heretofore made. And first I direct that my body be decently buried & as to such worldly estate as it hath pleased God to intrust me with, I dispose of the same as follows, first I direct that all my debts & funeral expenses to be paid as soon as I may appear as possible out of any money that I may see proper of or may first come into the hands of my executors from any portion of my estate real or personal. Secondly I give & bequeath to my wife Harriett during her natural life three several acres more named Harry & his wife Minah & one more named Rachel & the farm wherein I now live & bounded as follows, beginning down the creek at the mouth of a branch John Lay line then up 1/2 of ~~the creek~~ so as to include the field lying north east of the mill thence westwardly with the north side of 1/2 field & crossing the creek at the head of the mill pen & to the mouth of a lane the line between the farm called the Watcher farm & the farm wherein I now live & then with 1/2 lane to the first cross fence on the south side of 1/2 lane then with 1/2 cross fence southwardly & on in the same direction so as to include the field south east of the meeting house & round with 1/2 fence to the creek & down the creek as it bends to the beginning of I also give and bequeath to my wife two waggon & two horses & three mulch cows, eight killing hogs & ten year old hogs & three breeding sows & three beds complete & my riding carriage one two horse plough, two shovel ploughs & two rolling ploughs, two pair of gun two saws two spreading hoes & one axe one molar two pots two ovens & two kettles two sets of plates two sets of knives & forks & two sets of tea cups & saucers & one cup board one chest & one bureau & one clock, all of which she is to have choice of all I possess & in addition to the foregoing I give her my blacksmith tools my iron wrenched hammer & my chest saw & all the gun & sporting I have & my broad axe & all her own wearing cloths & all the money she has that is her own and also that she has on interest in her own name also six dollars worth of leather & one head of sheep one sythe & cradle & one morning sythe & I appoint my sons William & Laban to sit apart a sufficiency of all sorts of grain & provisions for her to support & on until she can raise again, all of which she is to possess during her natural life & at her death I will that the above named servant man Harry have his freedom with the privilege of buying his wife Minah if he may wish to do so & I will that Harry keep all the property that he claims as his own & also all the money he has in his hand or on interest by note in my name & all the balance of my estate I wish to be disposed of as follows first I give to my wife Harriett two several children one a son named

land, namely Joseph & Meloy to be valued to him at or after
my death they are Harry's children, Second I give & bequeath
to my son John one servant man named Peter at one hundred
dollars & one servant man named Cato, & one servant boy named
Marquis & Cafazello Harry's child both to be valued to him
at or after my death, third I give & bequeath to my son
William one servant man named Jesse & one servant boy named
Henry to be valued to him at or after my death fourth I give
& bequeath to my daughter Eve, one negro boy named George
& one servant girl named Matilda Harry's child both to be val-
ued to him at or after my death, fifth I give & bequeath to my
son David four servants children one girl & three boys the girl
named Julia a Polly child the boys named Morris, Ferdinand
& Fred Tuller, Rachel's children to be valued to him at or after
my death sixth I give & bequeath to my son Laban four
servant children, two boys & two girls named Julian & Isaac
Angeline Lafacet & Sarah Jane all Harry's children all to be
valued to him at or after my death, seventh I give & bequeath
to my son Alexander one servant woman named Sarah &
two children one Sarah's child named Cain, the other Harry's child
named Albert Jesse all to be valued to him at or after my death
I will that all the servants above bequeathed keep what is their
own & take it with them to their respective homes, Eighth I will that
my daughter Mary & my daughter Eve, alike & the lawful heirs
of my daughter Katharine (who is dead) all to have an equal
part of my estate both real & personal, with all my land
well to be paid to them by my executor & if this my will
give either of my heirs more than valued then an equal
part with the others of my heirs when they are to pay back
to my estate so as to give each an equal part of my estate
& I will that the large boundary of land that I bought of Sackett
Pick lying north west of the miller's Spring on the west side of the
road, called Lewis road, remain undivided & unsold for the
use of timber to all my children who remain in this country
& all of them to have an equal right with each other to use
timber from any part of said boundary of land & that without
compensation to the lawful heirs of my estate and no one of my
heirs or executor to sell or convey any part of said boundary
of land with the concurrence of all the others of my heirs who
remain in this country, however I will that Peter Sharp have
the land lying north of where James Robinson now lives to the top
of the Chestnut Ridge but not to prevent any of the balance of my
land from getting & using timber from any of the same at any
time, this last named portion of land to be bounded on the east
by lost creek & on the west by a leading hollow in which there is
a cave & a spring & the spring branch running into the cave
& whereas my sons John, John, & William & myself have a
new mill to be now in building on lost creek near
the head of said creek I give & bequeath to my son Peter & my

son, I give my present man Harry the prisoner to
his wife Maria at the death of my wife, I do hereby set
free he is to give forth which is two hundred dollars, & in
return to what I have bequeathed to my son David, I give &
bequeath to him my present girl Rachel at the death of my
wife & to be valued to him when he gets possession of her & in
return to what I have bequeathed to my wife, two table sea chain
cutting knives & box one loom & two iron to ferrow a nag
or a set of wagon wheels & all the books she claims as her
own & I water pails one washing tub & one churn one pair of
boards one barrel of salt 25 lbs of wool 20 lbs & all the
ten I have now growing, three dishes two kets and two
lastly it is my desire that this my present codicil be annexed
and be a part of my last will and testament to all intents
& purposes in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
at Seal this twenty fourth day of august one thousand eight
hundred & forty eight
