The Gardian is chargeable upon a former Settlement made the 1st day of January 1849 the sum of 552.42

To interest upon the same from the 1st day of January 1849 to the 1st day of January 1850 33.02

To amount of hire that was received and in the settlement one dollar ten cent and one an S.B. Ford in all the sum of 48.00 and third of which is chargeable in this settlement 2.76

To Rent of the house and ten yard for the year ending the 1st of January 1850 the sum of 26.66

The Gardian is entitled to the following credits to wit

1st By Repair to House and ten yard 26.66

2d By Board and blacking and harness for one year 33.00

By paid clerk for making and Recording this Settlement 1.50
