3rd I hereby confirm all things contained in my will and
1st codicil and which have not been revoked or altered by me
at this time.

4th as I have a grate many debts owing to me and which it is
probable my executors cannot collect otherwise than by taking
produce or labor I therefore hereby authorize and it is my wish
that my executors proceed to collect all such debts when ever
they can do so either in produce or in work or labor for the benefit
of my present family or in work or labor for the benefit
of my present family or of my estate hereby vesting a
discretionary power in my executors with regards to all such
debts and all collections in this way for the use of my present
family shall be good and valid and my said executors shall be
afforded therefor a settlement as if paid out in the ordinary way
5th as I have in contemplation to build ^{new} mill upon my lands
called the double place and which land is bequeathed to my son Haurton
Sewell it is my wish and desire that should the same not be built
or completed before my death that my executors have the same built
or completed as contemplated by me and the said mill and appur-
tenances shall and I give and bequeath the same to my son Haurton
Sewell and his heirs with the lands upon which it is to be built
as heretofore bequeathed to him, but my wife Ann Jane Sewell shall
have the same right to the enjoyment of the use and rents and profits
and for the same length of time as she has heretofore given her in my
other lands bequeathed by me, but no more and no longer.

And it is my wish that my executors use such debts and funds in
building or completing said mill, as in their discretion will be
least injurious and most beneficial to my estate and shall
have the right to use all such parts or materials of the old
mill now standing as may be useful in the new mill. The
old mill to stand and kept in operation until in building
the new mill it becomes necessary to be taken to pieces &

Will of Comfort Robinson.

In the presence of God. I, Comfort Robinson.

I Comfort Robinson of the town of Sagamore in the County of
Clarkston in the State of Tennessee being weak of body and
for advances in life, but if I could and disposing mind, do
make certain and publish these my last will and testament.

First and principally I commit my soul to the great
Author of my existence, and my body to the grave, to be
decently buried by my executors, my grave to be surrounded
with a metal or stone covering, or a stone wall raised
two feet high and of the size of the grave.

And as touching such worldly estate wherewith I have
possessed I do hereby dispose of the same as follows,
I desire - It is my will and desire that so soon as
may be after my death and burial that my executors

hereinafter to be named, take into their possession all
my estate, both real and personal including any money
that may belong to me, and to collect any and all debts
that may be due to me, out of which they shall defray

my funeral expenses (including the expense of fixing my
grave as is herein directed, and they shall pay my just
debts should any remain unpaid at my death.

Item - To give my daughter, my adopted daughter, in consid-
eration of her attention and affectionate conduct towards me
I give and bequeath my wardrobe and wearing apparel to be de-
livered to her by my executors whenever she may demand
the same.

Item - My will and desire is that my executors shall rent
my house and lot in the town of Sagamore to some care-
ful tenant with proper covenants to prevent waste, and the
rents and profits thereof during the natural life of my
husband William B. Robinson, shall be a fund in the
hands of my executors which after the payment of
taxes if said lot they shall appropriate in whole or
part as may be necessary for the support and maintenance
of my said husband William B. Robinson during his natural

Heav. My will and desire is that my executors permit my adopted daughter Jane Spillers to select any article of my household that she may choose, which is hereby given to her forever.

Heav. My will and desire is that my Executors sell my personal property not otherwise disposed of on such credit as will bring the best price. And after the payment of my just debts funeral expenses as well as a reasonable compensation to my executors for their trouble and expense in executing my will, the balance shall be paid over by them as herein after is directed by me.

Heav. My will further is that so soon as may be after the death of my husband William B. Robinson my executors sell my house and lot in the town of Concord upon such credit and terms as in their discretion will best, secure the best prices, and the proceeds of said house and lot, my portion of the rents and profits of said house and lot that may remain in their hands, upon the death of said Wm B. Robinson they shall hold to be disposed of hereafter by me in law and equity.

Heav. Because Jane Spillers my adopted daughter hath manifested towards me the affection of a dutiful child, and her children have ever treated me with a proper respect and because her son James hath accidentally become a cripple for life by the loss of one of his hands, whereby he hath in a great measure been deprived of the prospect of acquiring a living by manual labor. My will and desire is that the residue of my personal estate remaining in the hands of my executors after discharging the bequests herebefore made be paid into the hands of said Jane Spillers, and also that the funds arising from the sale of my house and lot, and any rents and profits that may arise from the same over and above what may be appropriated to my executors for the support and maintenance of my said husband Wm B. Robinson, be likewise paid into the hands of said Jane Spillers wife of William Spillers to be received and held by her in trust, for the support of her husband and children so far as need be and for the education of her children and especially for the support and education of her unfortunate son James, and I do enjoin upon the said Jane Spillers that she use all diligence and industry, in the improvement of such opportunities as may be afforded her of acquiring an education and qualifying herself for a useful and honorable station in society, and I do further enjoin upon the said James in all suitable and proper occasions whenever he may have the means of so doing without detriment to himself to contribute some sum (be it ever so small sum) to the Church of which I may die a member. Heav. In the event the said Jane Spillers should die before the payment of the moneys herein mentioned into her hands then they

shall be paid by my executors into the hands of the proper and lawful guardian of the children of the said Jane Spillers who shall receive the same and subject to the ~~rights~~ and limitations herein before expressed.

I do appoint William H. Henshaw and Peter Marcum executors to this my last will and testament hereby revoking all other wills and testaments by me heretofore made. Given under my hand and seal this 24th day of February 1843.
