3rd. I hereby confirm all things contained in my will and
Ist book and which have not been revealed or altered by me
at this time.

4th as I have a great many debts owing to me and which it is
probable my executors cannot collect otherwise than by taking
produce or labor I therefore hereby authorize and it is my wish
that my executors proceed to collect all such debts when ever
they can do so either in produce which shall be applied to the
use of my present family or in work or labor for the benefit
of my present family or of my estate hereby vesting a
descriptive power in my executors with regards to all such
debts and all collections in this way for the use of my present
family shall be good and valid and my said executors shall be
released therefor on settlement as if paid out in the ordinary way

5th as I have in contemplation to build ^{new} mill upon my lands
called the Hobb's place and which land is bequeathed to my son Houston
Sewell it is my wish and desire that should the same not be left
or completed before my death that my executors have the same built
as contemplated by me and the said mill and appur-
tenances shall and I give and bequeath the same to my son Houston
Sewell and his heirs with the lands upon which it is to be built
as heretofore bequeathed to him, but my wife Ann Jane Sewell shall
have the same right to the enjoyment of the use and rents and profits
and for the same length of time as she has heretofore given to me in my
other lands bequeathed by me, but no more and no longer -

And it is my wish that my executors use such debts and funds in
building or completing said mill, as in their discretion will be
least injurious and most beneficial to my estate and shall
have the right to use all such parts or materials of the old
mill now standing as may be useful in the new mill. The
old mill to stand and kept in operation until in building
the new mill it becomes necessary to be taken to pieces or

Will of Comfort Robinson.

In the name of God. Amen.
I Comfort Robinson of the town of Bagwell via the County of
Clayton in the State of Georgia being weak of body and
for advances in age, but of sound and disposing mind, do
make, ordain and publish this my last will and testament
First and principally I commit my soul to the great
Author of my existence, and my body to the grave, to be
decently buried by my executors, my grave to be surrounded
with a Circle or Stone Covering, on a stone wall raised
two feet high and of the size of the grave.

Second as touching such worldly estate wherewithal I hath
pleased God to bless me I dispose of the same as follows,
I dispossess - It is my will and desire that so soon as
may be after my death and burial, that my executors
hereinafter to be named, take into their possession all
my estate, both real and personal including any money
that may belong to me, and to collect any and all debts
that may be due to me, out of which they shall defray
my funeral expenses (including the expense of fixing my
grave as is herein directed), and they shall pay my just
debts should any remain unpaid at my death.

Third - To judge Spillars my adopted daughter, in consider-
ation of her attention and affectionate conduct towards me
I give and bequeath my wardrobe and wearing apparel to be de-
livered to her by my executors whenever she may demand
the same.

Fourth - My will and desire is that my executors shall rent
my house and lot in the town of Bagwell to some care-
ful tenant with proper carewants to prevent waste, and the
rents and profits thereof during the natural life of my
husband William B. Robinson, shall be a fund in the
hands of my executors which after the payment of the
taxes of said lot they shall appropriate in whole or
part as may be necessary for the support and mainten-
ance of my said husband William B. Robinson during his natural

Hence my will and desire is that my executors permit my adopted daughter Jane Spillers to select any article of my household that she may choose, which is hereby given to her forever.

Hence my will and desire is that my executors sell my personal property not otherwise disposed of or such credit as will bring the best prices. And after the payment of my just debts, funeral expenses as well as a reasonable compensation to my executors for their trouble and expense in executing my will the balance shall be paid over by them as hereinafter is directed by me.

Item My will further is that so soon as may be after the death of my husband William B. Robinson my executors sell my house and lot in the town of Somersell upon such credit and terms as in their discretion will bring the best prices, and the proceeds of said house and lot, any profits of the equity and profits of said house and lot that may remain in their hands upon the death of said Mr. B. Robinson they shall hold to be disposed of hereafter by me in this way.

Item Because Jane Spillers my adopted daughter hath married towards the affection of a dutiful child, and her children have ever treated me with a proper respect and because her son James hath accidentally become a cripple for life by the loss of one of his hands, whereby he hath no a great measure been deprived of the prospect of acquiring a living by manual labor. My will and desire is that the residue of my personal estate remaining in the hands of my executors after discharging the bequests hereinbefore made be paid in the hands of said Jane Spillers, and also that the sum rising from the sale of my house and lot, and any equity and property that may arise from the same over, and above what may be appropriated by my executors to the support and maintenance of my said Husband Mr. B. Robinson, be likewise paid into the hands of said Jane Spillers wife of William Spillers to be received and held by her in trust, for the support of her and children as far as need be and for the education of her children, and especially for the support and education of her unfortunate son James, and I do command upon the said James Spillers that he use all diligence and industry in the improvement of such opportunities as may be afforded him of acquiring an education and qualifying himself for a useful and honorable station in society, and I do further enjoin upon the said James on all suitable and proper occasions whenever he may have the means of so doing without detriment to himself to contribute some sum (to be determined) to the Church of which I may die a member.

Item In the event the said Jane Spillers should die before the payment of the money before mentioned into her hands then they

shall be paid by my executors into the hands of the proper and lawful guardian of the children of the said Jane Spillers who shall receive the same and subject to the same and limitations herein before expressed.

I do appoint William Houston and Peter Marcellus executors to this my last will and testament hereby revoking all other wills and testaments by me heretofore made.
