Williams, & David Williams this to have one dollar, Silas Williams Junior, Reliance
Wright, Nancy, Redenew, John Williams, Frederick Williams, Susanna Titman
Shewes Williams all of the above named this, except David Williams this, is to share
Equal in the proceeds of my property both real & personal. It is my will that
the 2 boys David & Calum have the privilege of putting, for manure to a horse and to
have the colts. It is my will that my Executors have, Asaiah, Calum & Mary
indicated so as to read, and the expenses to be paid out of the proceeds of my property.
It is my will that I do hereby nominate and appoint Silas Williams, Junior, and Robert
