

him forever; with her increase to be equally divided between them when they shall arrive to the age of twenty one year; to remain with Christian Backus him and his until the above mentioned time 8thly I leave to my executors, to be hereafter named, one negro boy named Jacob to be hired out by them, and the proceeds of the hire to be appropriated to the use of my son Andrew for his clothing, washing and shaving, except the sum of forty dollars, which is to be reserved of said hire, and paid to John Cooper, four years after my death to discharge a debt of my son Andrew's. Furthermore, it is my will that if the said negro boy should outlive my son Andrew Booth, then viz that case he becomes the property of my son Henry and William Booth to be equally divided between them - 9thly I give and bequeath to my son William Booth the plantation upon Snow Line, after the death of my beloved wife Margaret Booth also one cow and calf one bed and furniture and one negro girl named mildly with her increase to her and his heirs forever 10thly I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary Booth one negro girl named Siller with her increase, she cow and calf one bed and furniture and one ewe and lamb to her and her heirs forever to take possession of them as soon as she shall arrive to the age of twenty one year or whenever she marries - 11thly Lastly I appoint my sons James Booth & Henry Booth Executors to this my last will and testament hereby ratifying this and annulling all others. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the twenty third day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirteen
