I have not been Specific in a distribution of the above property because I believe my Executors will Act honestly and for the best The residue of my property after complying with the above directions I wish to be divided Equally among all my Brothers & Sisters and I do appoint James Trimble John Whitlender and Thomas M. 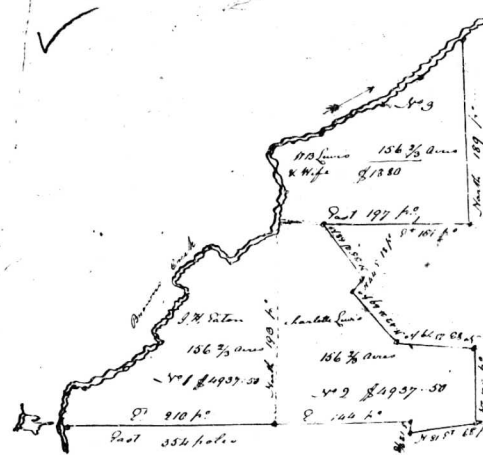

Blount equally share and share alike the nett proceeds of the sale.

Item I give and bequath to my Nephew John Gray Blount son of John Gray Blount my Tract of Land containing two hundred and ninety six Acres lying adjoining the Town of Jacksonburg on the North western boundary thereof also eight hundred & fifty Acres of Land in the State of Tennessee lying on Duck River at or near the mouth thereof being the same that was conveyed to me by Deed from my Brother Willie Blount to him and his heirs and assigns forever.

Item I give and bequath to my Nephew Thomas Harper Blount son of John Gray Blount my Tract of Land lying in the Jack Swamps Pitt county containing by estimation six hundred and forty Acres to him and his heirs & assigns forever. Item I give and bequath to the three sons of my Brother John B. Blount or the Survivors or survivor of them at the time of my death my Share of Shell cattle near Duck Lake to be divided among them equally share and share alike to them and their heirs and assigns forever.

Item I give and bequath to my two Nieces Ann Blount Toole and Mary Blount Miller a Tract of Land in the State of Tennessee containing six hundred and forty Acres to be set apart to them by my Executors herein after named out of my share of the lands owned by John Gray and Thomas Blount to them and their heirs and assigns forever.
