 hath of the Grace of God calling to mind the Mortality of the Body knowing that it is appointed
 for all men Once to die and afterwards to Judgment. But being weak in Body and down of
 Memory. I do recommend my Soul to God like good at this my last day to be executed by the
 Discretion of my Executors and of all the worldly Goods as I have possessed of I Give and bequeath
 in this form and Manner following. Devising this my last Will and Testament and all former
 Wills to be Void. Then I Give to my Son Sampson Williams One tract or parcel of Land
 containing One hundred and thirty Eight of Land being part of a tract of Land conveyed from
 Thomas Thompson me and to him a tract of Land of Jacob Thompson on the South cut off
 by a Parallel Line through the tract from East to West. Then I Give to
 my Daughter Josephs Cornick Forty Acres of Land to begin the above tract of Land on the East
 the heirs of William Sampson on the West cut off from my said tract of Land a Division Line
 from North to South. And the remaining part of my said tract of Land I Give and bequeath
 to my Son Wright Williams. Then I Give and bequeath to the three
 names of my Son James Williams on Deed who is incapable of getting his Living and Negro
