whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this the

County Court Nov Term 1868; then the last will and Testament of  
Abraham Shook was presented to Court in solemn form for  
probate and was duly proved by the Oaths of W. S. Wharton & John  
Matthews the Subscribing witnesses thereto & ordered to be

I Abraham Shook do hereby make this writing my last will  
& Testament & I do name my Executor here after named  
to sell my house farm or as much thereof as may be necessary  
to pay all my debts & he is hereby authorized & empowered  
to sell the same either publicly or privately as he may  
think best & to make my Executor & sales to the same  
& I do I & these and bequeath to my daughter in Law  
Eliza Ross Shook wife of O. S. Shook to her sole & separate  
use the following described tract of land it being a part  
of the place on which I now live beginning at the foot  
of the Mountain near the upper end of the same by the  
orchard & running on a line west of the Gordon's until  
it gets below the corner of 9 four Rods & 6 of the said  
thence west to Benj. Elliott thence south with said  
Elliott line to the Isaac Grays fifty Acre & with it to  
the beginning also my horses & Cattle and one Black Cow  
& my 2 Horse Hay & Corn & Rogers & Rogers place on Road  
off the Proctor place & I do I & these and bequeath to my daughter  
the remainder of my land off of the Mountain & to be divided  
equally between James H. Shook Cynthia A. Landley wife  
of James L. Landley & Dorah widow of O. A. Shook dec'd & I do  
I name my Executor to see in that publicly or privately the

residue of my horses <sup>and</sup> Cattle <sup>and</sup> Stock <sup>and</sup> Hogs <sup>and</sup> divide the  
 proceeds between James K Shoor Sarah Shoor <sup>and</sup> Cynthia H.  
 Handley. I will <sup>and</sup> desire that my lands and the <sup>and</sup> maintain  
 the debt <sup>and</sup> equally divided between James K Shoor Sarah Shoor <sup>and</sup> Eliza  
 R Shoor <sup>and</sup> Cynthia A Handley I will <sup>and</sup> hereby appoint my  
 son James K Shoor Executor of this my will. I will of <sup>and</sup>  
 divide my Books <sup>and</sup> Household <sup>and</sup> Kitchen furniture <sup>and</sup>  
 beds <sup>and</sup> bed clothes to be equally divided between J K Shoor <sup>and</sup>
