 Franklin County } of the County and State aforesaid do make and
 publish this as my last will and testament
 First I will that as soon after my death as possible my executor
 hereafter to be named pay my funeral and testamentary expenses
 and first debts. Secondly, I give to my daughter Mary Ann
 Hutchins wife of John Hutchins for her use for life a negro
 woman named Lucia and her son John after my said daughter's
 death I give the said slaves to the use of her body and
 theirs heirs forever. Fourthly I have heretofore advanced my
 daughter Lucinda Campbell wife of Amos Campbell of Mississippi
 beyond her proportion of my estate I cannot greatly harm
 her anything. Fourthly I have heretofore advanced my
 son James H. Young to his proportion of my estate I cannot
 greatly harm him anything. Fifthly I give to my daughter
 Ann & Anderson wife of William Anderson of Virginia
 and to her heirs forever the sum of three hundred dollars
 a feather bed high post bedstead and necessary bed furniture
 Sixthly I give to my daughter Amanda Washington wife of
 James M. Washington of Mississippi for her use for life a negro
 boy named Washington. After my said daughter's death
 I give the said slaves to the use of her body and theirs
 heirs forever. Seventhly I have heretofore advanced
 my daughter Virginia Campbell wife of Arthur L.
 Campbell I cannot therefore harm her anything. Eighthly
 I give to my son John H. Young and his heirs
 forever a negro woman named Fanny and her son Sam
 a negro boy named Jeff a negro man named Choker
 and a negro man named Joshua and his wife Amy a small
 jelly cheston used by Mordant and a feather bed bedstead
 and furniture should Mordant be wounded disabled or
 crippled in his present tour of military service or in the
 discharge of any act necessarily connected therewith I give
 to him and his heirs forever another negro man named
 Alfred. I hereby constitute Thomas Nelson of Tennessee
 Guardian of my said Mordant with directions to put the boy
 Jeff and Sam to such a trade as he thinks proper to hire out
 the rest of Mordant's negroes to apply a sufficiency of the proceeds
 to his maintenance and education and when Mordant shall have
 attained the age of twenty one to deliver the property he is entitled
 to him together with the remaining proceeds. Mordant's
 possessions. I charge Mordant to break Joshua and Amy honestly
 in their old age. I solemnly charge him to obey the directions
 forever the advice and to quitclaim the guardianship of his said Mordant
 and my friend Thomas Nelson. Ninthly I will to my grand
 daughter Elizabeth Hutchins daughter of John and Mary Ann Hutchins
 and to her heirs forever a negro girl named Martha daughter
 of Lucia should she die without issue or before the age of twenty
 one.

 I give to my Grandson William Alexander Young son of my son
 James and to his heirs forever a negro man named Nathan
 and a Negro girl named Sarah should he die without issue
 or before the age of twenty one then to the issue of his father
 and their heirs forever. Trulyly I give to my Grandson
 William Alexander Campbell son of Arthur and Virginia
 Campbell and to his heirs forever a Negress girl named
 Sarah should he die without issue or before twenty one
 then to the issue of his father and their heirs forever. Trulyly
 should Alfred not fall to my death conditioned I will that
 my Executor sell the said Alfred and Bill and Andrew and
 any other slave belonging to me and not herein named and
 apply the proceeds to the payment of the Legacy to my daughter
 Anne Anderson the balance of any will be hers after
 appropriation. Trulyly I will that the unappropriated
 proceeds of the sale of the three negroes above named and
 the proceeds of the sale of the whole of my personal property
 and effects not hereinbefore and hereafter legumatched
 and which personal property and effects I direct my
 Executor to sell and that all my remaining ready money
 and claims for money not hereafter disposed of be divided
 between my wife and the children of my son James
 my wife to have one half - Trulyly I give to the children
 of my son James the Articles of personal property belonging
 to me and not otherwise disposed of and now in the possession
 of James I also give to the said children the house of the said
 now occupied by James. I direct my Executor to purchase
 with the money legumatched to the said children if sufficient
 one hundred and fifty acres or as much as he can purchase
 of the said land should it be offered for sale for the said
 children of my son James and their respective heirs forever.
 Trulyly I direct that the negroes herein ordered to be
 sold be sold in this County to a person who will probably
 keep them in this County at public or private sale as he may
 see fit to my Executor on a credit of one two and three years
 Trulyly should my claims upon persons in Virginia
 Maryland The District of Columbia or elsewhere be paid
 I will that they be equally divided between my children.
 Trulyly I charge my children to see that said debts are
 collected and also the construction of this my will I direct
 my Executor and them to submit controverted matters in the
 first instance to the arbitrament of honest and disinterested
 men. I constitute and appoint Thomas Wilson of this State
 Executor of this my last will and Testament. Trulyly
 in consequence of my confidence in the integrity of Thomas
 Wilson I will that he be not required to give security for
 the performance of his duties as Executor.
