Hale my wife in the County of Green in her own right and her heirs forever and lastly I hereby constitute and appoint Randolph Ross Alexander H. Hale and Sidney Able Executors of this my last will and testament. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 2nd day of June 1852
