chattels that the tenth of September in the year of our Lord
One thousand eight hundred and thirty three in the manner
and form following (viz) I give and bequeath my lawful
wife Mary Brown all my property during her lifetime
my land and premises containing One hundred and twenty three
acres. I wish all my debts to be paid out of my property
I do hereby appoint Josiah Berry my lawful administrator
to settle all my business truly & justly in an equal
manner any other Will record or instrument of writing to be
contrary is hereby null and void for I do acknowledge this to be my
last Will and Testament this day and date above mentioned
