Item 6th I bore my friend Col. Benjamin Hallingworth sole
Executor to this my last will and Testament "In witness where

In the Name of God Amen, I Anthony Seal of the County
of Franklin and State of Tennessee being at this time in
a low state of health yet of sound mind and perfect
understanding do call to memory that it is appointed
for all men once to die "I do make constitute and
appoint this my last will and Testament bearing and
his annulling all others I do make and form forth following
namely, I give my body to the Lord in which I trust
at the discretion of my Executors and my soul to God who
governs it; Secondly I give that all my just debts be
paid out of the monies left on hand or, Thirdly I will and bequeath
to my beloved wife Kimba the sole and entire care and possession
and possession of all my property left at my decease both real
and personal to her sole use and benefit to be used disposed
of as she may think proper and at her discretion to be there

entirely dispose of as she may think proper in testimony
whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal affixed my self at this
4th day of January 1824

In the name of God Amen: I Calable Boor of the County of Transylvania
in the State of Tennessee being of sound mind and memory and
understanding but considering the uncertainty of human life do
make this my last Will and Testament in the following manner to wit
I recommend my body to the Earth and to be buried in a decent
manner and my soul to God who gave it and as to the Worldly Estate
with which Providence has blessed me I give all unequivocally
in manner following (to wit) as it was ever was my intention to
post my negro woman Jane & her children until God should
see cause to post them. I have sold them all unto William
Hobbs and have received part of the price of them my self but
there yet remains in his hands four hundred dollars which
I have in his hands for my son William McCaney Boor
which he is to pay in the time of year or set years after
my death in good trade at market price at his own house
in good clothing or in other property as my son stands in need
of for the which the sd Hobbs is to give his note to my son
William McCaney Boor and these notes to be lodged in the hands of
my son Joseph Boor for him to see that my son William gets the good of
the sd and the rest of all my property horses and cows pigs
household furniture and plantation tools and all my notes and money
and the land I live upon now as my right is to be paid when I
die & to leave it in the hands of my son Joseph Boor. all for the
use of my son William McCaney Boor to get the benefit of it as he
stands in need in money or in other property as my son stands
in need all of it except what I now mention to the rest of my
children besides this in the first place I do leave to my son
William a feather. And an under Bed and bedstead with good
Woolens covering as likewise I leave to my son John Boor my
Jewelry. Pearls and Smoothing plain and a box (called Fisher with
ten dollars in money. And to my deceased son Samuel children
I do leave them ten dollars in money to be divided among them
I leave to my son Joseph Boor my five dogs and a good and new
Dictionary with ten dollars in money and to all my Daughters
to Harriet to Morgan and to my Daughter Jane I leave to them
three ten dollars apiece in money but none to my Daughter
Margaret I leave likewise unto my Grand son James H Boor
son to William H Boor my Rifle Gun and my Blue broad cloth
Coat for his service done to me in Eight hundred & twenty two
