 I desire to my said wife one bay mare 8 or 9 years old and
 also one brown white 2 year old and one year of other and
 Thayer in good running order and Condition and all the
 sheep that I now own 20 head stock of hogs and two
 choice Dutch cows and my buggy and harness and my threshing
 machine and my straw scutcher and corn sheller and two good
 ploughs and goats two hand plows two milk pails and
 two turning ploughs and two hogs and log chain and
 one cross cut and hand saw all a good chisel hand
 axe on hand at my death and I desire my wife my share
 of the money worth."
