in the State of Tennessee being of sound mind and memory and
understanding well considering the uncertainty of human life do
make this my last will and Testament in the following manner: I bequeath
and recommend my body to the Earth and to be buried in a decent
manner and my soul to God who gave it and as to the worldly Estate
with which Providence has blessed me I give all and legacies
in manner following: I give as it never was my intention to
put my negro woman Jane & her children with all God should
see cause to put them. I have sold them all with the same
Yoblet and have received part of the price of them myself but
there yet remain in his hands four hundred dollars which
I give in his hands for my son William McConny Borr
which he is to pay in the time of year or six years after
my death in good trade at market price at his own house
in good clothing or in other property as my son stands in need
of for the which the sd Yoblet is to give his note to my son
William McConny Borr and these notes to be lodged in the hands of
my son Joseph Borr for him to see that my son William gets the good of
the sd. and the rest of all my property horses and cows dogs
household furniture and plantation tools and all my notes and money
and the land I live upon now as my right is to be paid when I
die & to share it in the hands of my son Joseph Borr. all for the
use of my son William McConny Borr & for the benefit of it as he
stands in need in money or in other property as my son stands
in need all of it except what I now mention to the rest of my
children besides him in the first place. I do leave to my son
William a feather bed an under bed and bedstead with good
pillows covering & coverlet I leave to my son John Borr my
Jewelry Plate and something plain and a box called Fisher with
ten dollars in money. And to my deceased son Samuel children
I do leave them ten dollars in money to be divided among them
I leave to my son Joseph Borr my five dogs and food and my
Dictionary with ten dollars in money and to all my daughters
to Cornelia to Morgan and to my daughter Jenny I leave to them
three ten dollars apiece in money but none to my daughter
Margaret. I leave likewise unto my Grand son James H. Borr
son to William H. Borr my Rifle Gun and my Blue broad cloth
Coat for his service done to me in Eight hundred & twenty two

I have likewise to Betsy Bays one dollar my my books
and my clothes to be divided as the see fit among my children
and now I have my son William McConney and my
son Joseph Burr Executors of my Estate and I wish you both
to see that my son William McConney Burr does not suffer
while what I have in your hands is that shut up but
if he should die before it is all gone I wish you to
divide what remains in your hands of my Property to
divide it equally to all my children but fairly and for their
best to get good of it now Betsy Bays none now this is
my last Will and Testament and that it to be complied with
as it stands and now I conclude with the words of the
verse in ps. for God and keep his commandments of love
and love in love and in peace and you may expect the
God of love and peace shall be with you amen. And I
do hereby make this my last Will and Testament revoking
all former Wills heretofore made in testimony whereof I
have hereunto set my hand and seal this thirtieth day of Nov. at
five the year of our Lord one thousand Eight hundred &
twenty three

Franklin and State of Tennessee being of sound mind and
memory and considering the uncertainty of death and the uncertainty
of life do hereby make and declare this my last Will and
Testament in manner and form as follows: First I
wish that all my just debts be faithfully paid. Secondly
I bequeath to my wife Mary Kelly during her natural life
a certain negro woman named Rachel and her two children and
all the household & kitchen furniture which remains after
my decease and at her death I wish the whole of this property
to be sold on a post sufficient to raise the sum of one
hundred and forty two dollars and that sum to be equally
divided between my Grand children namely Selma P.
Lucia and John P. Kelly Benjamin Kelly third and of any
over plus remains I wish to give the sum of five dollars
each of my Daughters in addition to what I have given
them heretofore namely to my Daughter Mary Ann Bonfield
the sum of five dollars to my Daughter Alice Bonfield five
dollars to my Daughter Rachel McCalister five dollars to my
Daughter Nancy McCalister five dollars and to each of my
five daughters five dollars and if any over plus remains of all this
or any other personal property I wish it equally divided between
