 us in their presence & he his last will & testament on  
 the day it bears date that he was of sound mind & disposing  
 memory at the time he signed the same and that they regard  
 their names thereon as witnesses in the presence and at the request  
 of of the Testator. Thereupon it was ordered by the Court that said

I Catharine Sandridge do make and publish this as my last  
 will & testament hereby revoking and making void all other Wills  
 by me at any time made. First I declare that my funeral expenses  
 & all my debts be paid as soon after my death as possible out of  
 any money that I may be possessed of or my first come  
 into the hands of my Executor. Secondly, I direct that my  
 Executor to have a free and full power to sell over my grave and  
 have the same good where my husband is & where I desire  
 to be buried & buried in. Thirdly, I direct that my Executor to  
 have possession as soon as I die & before he is qualified of all  
 my property both real and personal and after he is qualified to  
 sell the same both real and personal as soon as convenient  
 and to make in his report as executor such title to my real  
 estate as I could if living. And in case he is unable to sell my  
 land immediately he is directed to trust at least one year until a  
 sale can be effected. Fourthly, I give & bequeath with  
 to the children of Thomas Chodup died late of Va One hundred  
 dollars each. Fifthly I give & bequeath to the children of Henry  
 Modine died one half of the remainder of my estate after paying the  
 legacy to Thomas died. Sixthly, I give & bequeath to  
 Susan Davis wife of Mr. Davis and Susan a child wife of George  
 Miller & John the son of Henry three for an equal share the balance  
 or the other half of my estate & lastly I do hereby nominate & appoint  
 & I desire my Executor to execute & witness of I do to this my will  
 my hand & seal this 10<sup>th</sup> day of September 1850  
 Signed sealed & published in our presence & Catharine Sandridge  
 we have subscribed our names here to in presence of the Testator this day of Sept 1850
