 it is my will and desire that as soon after my death as practicable
 all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid out of the
 money on hand or the first monies that come to the hands
 of my Executor: I then say how considering all my his and
 they the advances made by me to them in my life time
 I will provide to make a final distribution of the residue
 of my property: I then say I give and bequeath to my two youngest
 grand children Nancy and Joseph Cheever of my son Daniel
 Champion each the sum of four hundred dollars to be paid
 out of my estate hereby paid Mary E. & Ruth Champion
 these parts of my estate which was four hundred dollars
 I then say I give and bequeath to my grandson William Downie
 two hundred dollars to be paid out of my estate I then say as
 to all the rest of the residue of my estate both in real estate
 and personal I give and bequeath to my daughter Norcia a
 wife of Peter Lushan Frankly wife of James L. Cowling
 wife of John D. Kelly and wife of William C. Hilderson
 and to the heirs of George H. Champion in equal portions
 I then say that if my grandson William Downie
 who is provided for in the fourth clause of this will should
 die without issue then said leg. of bequeath to him
 I hereby direct to be paid to my said children and to the
 heirs of George H. Champion as mentioned in I then say in
 equal proportions it being my intention that they all be
 made equal in my estate: I then say I nominate and constitute
 and appoint William C. Hilderson my son in law Executor of
 this my last will and Testament: In witness whereof I have
