death of my Wife I also give unto him the profits arising
from the Land he had owned also what he may hereafter
own the thirty two acres to be laid off adjoining the said

of John Donathan to him and his heirs forever. I give and bequeath unto my son in Law James Donathan Ten Dollars at the death of my wife to him and his heirs forever. I give and bequeath unto my son in Law John Ingram five Dollars at the death of my wife to him and his heirs forever. I give and bequeath unto my son in Law the Lagan two Dollars and fifty Cents at the death of my wife to him and his heirs forever. I give and bequeath unto my son Matthew Robertson two Dollars and fifty cents at the death of my wife to him and his heirs forever. I give and bequeath unto my son James Robertson two Dollars and fifty cents to him and his heirs forever. I give the balance of my estate not before disposed of I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife during her natural life and at her death I wish it to be equally divided between my daughters which shall then be living and the children of those which may be dead including those now dead each party choosing a person to appraise the same and then divide it equally between them to them and their heirs forever. I do hereby constitute & appoint my son Matthew Robinson sole executor of this my last will and Testament hereby revoking all wills before made by me - In it stands whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 1st day of June in the year Eighteen hundred and twenty one.
