the property left to me by wife Patsy Gordon and not heretofore
divided to be equally divided among them the children of Patsy
Foster leaving one share to them and their heirs forever and
lastly I appoint my wife Patsy Gordon and my son Pamphlet
Gordon my executor and executrix to carry into effect this my
last will and Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto

my last will and Testament in manner and form following to wit
That I commit my soul to our Heavenly Father God my body I wish to
be buried by my Executors on the place lately given and by my
son John C. Tanner. That I bequeath to my wife Nancy Tanner during
her natural life or widowhood, six negro slaves, Caroline, Ruth
Elizabeth Jane and Moses together with one large family Bible
and one Gray horse. That I give and bequeath to my daughter Susan
+ 3 silver pieces one silver bowl glass seven silver taddy spoons to
her and her heirs forever. That I give and bequeath to my son
John C. Tanner one Rifle Gun one silver watch one set of childrens
Circus clopades in 12 volume & Morshals Life of Washington in 3 volumes
to him and his heirs forever. That I give and bequeath to my
Daughter Martha A. Tanner one Gray mare one English cow & her
increase two sows and pigs four ewes and lambs on Horns and
saddles & saddle one Brewhouse and Dressing Table one bed &
furniture and bedstead one set of striped Curtains two flower
patches half dozen Blue plates four China plates one Red Tea
Board one set of dish mats one carpet together with all the
household which bore her name written in them to her and her
heirs forever. That I bequeath to my Daughter Martha A. Tanner
four negro slaves Judith Joshua, Isaac and Caleb and their

and at her death I give and bequeath the said four
negros and their increase to the children of the said Martha
A Tammes of her body lawfully begotten but should the said
Martha A Tammes die leaving no child as above then and
in that case I give and bequeath the said four negros
and their increase to be equally divided among the children
of my daughter Susan B Williams of her body lawfully begotten
to them and their heirs respectively forever. I give and bequeath
to my grand son James Rust Williams one parcel of land and
at the death of my wife Nancy Tammes I give the said
James R Williams one slave house bound her to him and his
heirs forever. I give at the death or marriage of my wife
Nancy Tammes I give and bequeath to my son John C Tammes
Cordelia of Jesse but not that we are one large family
while provided he should continue to live in Franklin County
State of Tennessee as long as his mother lives take care of her
I give at the death or marriage of my wife Nancy Tammes I
give and bequeath to my daughter Martha A Tammes one
negro fully manned, mares to her and her heirs forever.
I give after the death or marriage of my wife Nancy Tammes
I give and bequeath to my Grand daughter Nancy Williams
one negro girl Ruth & her increase to her and her heirs forever
I give I also give to my Grand daughter Judith Williams at
the death or marriage of my wife Nancy Tammes one negro
girl Elizabeth and her increase to her and her heirs forever.
I give all the rest and residue of my property not heretofore
disposed of after payment of all my just debts in Franklin
County State of Tennessee I leave to my beloved wife Nancy
Tammes during her natural life or shall have to do with
liberty to sell any of the slaves or to dispose of any of the
property for the necessary support. (Except the negros a
gray horse a Red Cow without horns and the family bible
and that Martha A Tammes have a necessary support out
of my property with the addition of the property already
bequeathed but should she marry I give at the death or
marriage of my wife Nancy Tammes I give and bequeath
the last above mentioned property to be equally among my
three children John C Tammes Susan B Williams and Martha A
Tammes to them and their heirs forever. I give should my son John
C Tammes remove from Franklin County State of Tennessee before
the death of his Mother Nancy Tammes or neglect to take the
necessary care of his Mother then in that case I give and bequeath
the negros Cordelia of Jesse to my daughter Susan B Williams
and Martha A Tammes & their heirs forever. I give
I do hereby appoint my son John C Tammes and my son in
law James B Williams Executors of this my last will and
Testament hereby revoking all other wills heretofore by
me made In testimony whereof I have hereunto subscribed
