 Will I Eliza Quinn of the County of Franklin & State of Tennessee
 do make and publish this my last will & Testament
 hereby revoking and making void all former wills by me
 at any time heretofore made. To such force & effect as
 it shall please a just & merciful God to submit me
 with I dispose of the same as follows: First I desire that
 all my debts be paid as soon after my decease as possible
 out of any money that I may be possessed of or may come
 into the hands of my Executors from any portion of my
 personal property. Secondly I give and bequeath unto
 my beloved wife Elizabeth Quinn all I possess: To wit
 my land and negroes also all of my personal property
 if I should have any during my natural life or widowhood
 at the death of my beloved wife I give and bequeath to my

Son Samuel Sins all of my land and the following negroes to wit
 my Boy Tom and his wife Fanny also my daughter Dora and her
 George and a girl by the name of Lina " I give him also a
 horse saddle Bridle and Bedstead and furniture to his bed
 and my son Samuel should die without an heir I desire
 what lands and negroes with the ungare to be divided
 up to my daughter Dorah as hers forever; I give and
 bequeath to my daughter Dorah the following negroes
 Joseph, two white children an and. Dolly Elizabeth girls
 by the name of Lida and her son. I give her also a horse
 saddle Bridle and Bedstead and furniture " If my daughter
 Dorah should die without an heir I want the negroes and
 this ungare which I have given her to go to the Brothers
 Samuel Sins my wife can at her own discretion at any
 time before her death give to either of the before named
 children any or all of the property therein given them
 But left to do as she thinks best at the death of my wife
 I wish all of my stock of my land household and
 kitchen furniture " She may she left sold and divided
 between my four children as she sees fit. Ellen Colson
 Hester and William Samuel and Dorah after giving to
 Christiana Station a horse saddle and Bridle I do hereby
 make ordain and appoint my wife and Samuel Sins
 my Son my Executors of this my last will and Testament
 and whosoever of 2 Elisha Sins the said Station have
 to this my will one sheet of paper out my hand and
 Seal this 20th day of August 1857
 Signed Sealed & published in the presence
 of us who have subscribed in Elisha Sins (208)
 the presence of the Justices and of each other
 J. Taylor
