Know all men by these presents that I Elizabeth Lasater widow
 of Joseph Lasater Deceased of the County of Franklin State of
 Tennessee being now well and in perfect mind
 and memory and calling to mind the mortality of my body and
 knowing that it is appointed for all men to die do hereby
 and make this my last Will & Testament first of all and
 singular I give my soul to God who gave it and my body
 to a decent burial at the discretion of my Executors
 knowing that it will be raised again at the general
 resurrection. Secondly as to my worldly Estate wherewith it
 has pleased God to bless me after paying all my just
 debts and other necessary expenses I give and bequeath after
 the following manner that is I give gratefully to my grand
 daughter *Elizabeth Cheek* daughter of *Walter Cheek* I give
 a Brown Cow and calf *Sharon* as the Bull cow also to my
 grand daughter *Nancy Cummins* I give a Brindle Cow with
 the calf to my daughter *Nancy Jones* I give choice of my
 figured counterpane and my best bed and my beds and
 bed clothing I give to the children of my daughter *twelve*
 like of *Chloe* and *Elizabeth* there to be equally divided between
 the four families of children all but what is otherwise
 thrust away also a choice Bed quilt to my grand daughter
Elizabeth Jones wife of *James Jones* to *Liza J. McCall*
 a certain sum of money that I purchased of her mother and a
 silver saddle that I also purchased of her mother *Chloe* of *Chloe*
 to my son *John Lasater* I give my horse and buggy and to my
 son *Abner Lasater* without I appoint my Executors in fact
 and do not require any security for his due observance my
 small silver and my hand and to my son in Law *Sherrad*
 there my two negroes and a child. To the children of my
 daughter *Chloe* I give the following

I do it to the McClellane & give my big cow and cow her calf to John
 H. McClellane any young red heifer to the children of Sarah
 Lasater widow of my son Thomas & Lasater Richard. I give
 him speckled cows the one that has a Bull calf to Thomas H.
 Lasater the other to Hugh Lasater and the white heifer to John Lasater
 to the daughter of James A. Jones Sarah Ann Jones the big
 milky cow and the best steer that I have and to James A.
 Jones two steer yearlings also to my son Richard at Lasater
 I give my two year old Cully also my loom and harness
 for the same to my grand daughter Mary E. McClellane and
 further it is my will that the above property that we
 should to children that is under age be given up to their
 parents to keep for them and if child of mine my daughter
 should marry for her to sell the property to her and there of as
 she could not conveniently carry and keep the money for
 her children the balance of my property to be sold and
 after paying my debts and other necessary expenses as above
 named to be divided between my daughter Ches McClellane
 and the children of my daughter Elizabeth these signed sealed
 and witnessed published and promulgated in presence of us
 the fourteenth day of September in the of our Lord eight
 hundred and forty seven
