memory calling to mind the uncertainty of
life and the certainty of death having hope towards God through
our Lord Jesus Christ do make and publish this my last
will and testament in manner and form following That is
to say first I give my soul to God who gave it and my body
to the Lord and a debt but plain debts my will is
that all my just debts and my funeral Expenses be
paid as soon after my death as possible and that all
of my property both personal and real that may be left
after paying these my debts shall be kept together by

natural life or until she dies if my said wife should
marry then my will is that all my property be divided
equally except my son Joseph who I hereby give and be-
queath to him which must be paid to him about the
first and also my son William to have my Conformation tools
along the rest of the balance to be equally divided between
all my children and my wife Hannah Lastly my will is
and I do hereby constitute and appoint Job Chittwood and my
son George H. Smith my Executors of this my last will and
testament in testimony whereof I have set my hand
