Saunders Jarvis Memorandum of the last Will and Testament of Francis Turner
 Will
 That on the 29th day of January One thousand Eight hundred and forty seven Francis Turner a citizen of the County of Franklin State of Tennessee being sick of the sickness whereof he died on the first day of February following about 3 o'clock A.M. at his dwelling house in the County of said State aforesaid did make and declare his last Will and Testament in the words following that is to say my desire is that my wife Mary Turner receive upon and in possession of the premises on which I now live that after all my just debts are paid I desire my wife to keep the property that is left to gather for the purpose of raising my family. I desire my wife to give those of my children that are at home as they grow up and those her portions of my property as I have given to those that have left and when my children are all raised I desire my wife to have a third part of the property to do as she pleases with and the remainder of my property to be equally divided between my children so that they may all prosper. If there is not enough on hand to pay all my debts I desire my tract of land on Dry Creek

adjoining the place on which I live and known as the Morgan
Place or Morgan tract of land to be used for that purpose
I desire my Brother Robinson & Sumner to aid and assist
my wife in the management and disposing up of my estate
these words or words to the like effect, This said George W.
Sumner declared in the presence of the Quaker witnesses with
the intention that this same should be his last will and
testament whereof he desired them to be or witness by
calling them to his sick side and declaring said words to them
