I do hereby that my Smith tools and Rifle and Fiddle to be sold and paid the use of paying debts. I hereby constitute and appoint my beloved wife and my son Jacob Groves sole Executors my last Will and Testament. I also will that my Executors shall collect all my just debts pay all my just debts. I hereby will these my children that is now with me on three that are to have an equal part of my Estate as the has been distributed to the others. I further

will that my wife shall be prohibited if she dies a widow from distributing more to one child than another in this my last Will and Testament. I have hereunto set my hand and seal in presence of

First of all I do give and bequeath to my beloved wife Mary whilst in widowhood all the Plantations that I now live on with the house and appurtenances thereto belonging with plows and all necessary farming tools that I now belong with all the household furniture with beds and bedding & what I also give and bequeath to her my beloved wife all my stores of Horses that is to say one or more two horses all my stores of cattle also all my stores of hogs I also will that my beloved wife Mary at her death have the whole disposal of this my estate as she will but in case of her marrying again the whole after the raising of the children to be equally divided with her and my beloved children that I do give and bequeath to my beloved son George my Rifle gun Powder horn and shot Bag.

I do also hereby constitute and appoint my beloved wife Mary and Thomas Dungan Sole Executors of this my last will and Testament. I also will that my Executors sell all my shop and Cooper tools only my hand saw & drawing knife which I also give and bequeath to my beloved wife. I also will that my Executors discharge all my just debts and collect all the just debts due to me and in testimony of this being my last will and Testament. I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 18 day of Nov 1809 in presence of 3

 being in my right mind as a donation I will unto my wife Jane all my Estate to possess it her life time and at her death to dispose of it all at her pleasure except the negro woman Pheby whom I will free at her death that is at my wife's death and also I will that John Bickingsley at her death shall have one half of my part of the land whereon I now reside that is the balance of the tract I have purchased of Robert Beane after allowing Thomas Blair & Robert Beal on their complying with their contract to have their respective parts contracted for and also Doctor Jonathan Edmunds on ^{his} complying to have his part the one half of the balance at my wife's death I will unto John Bickingsley or if in case the land should not be obtained of Robert Beane I will that the money paid to Robert Beane for said land and as much of the land warrants as will amount to the price of the said land shall be disposed of for land and that John Bickingsley shall have one half of said land at my wife's death that this is my last will and Testament I have hereunto set my hand and seal in the presence of God and the before writing witnesses
