 man named Sams and negro boy named Jack one negro
 woman named Leger and one negro woman named
 Anorly and her children Sarah the latter that survives on the
 day during her natural life or widowhood and at her
 death or marriage to be equally divided between all
 my children the house held for the use of the family
 the same as if I was living for the use of the family
 I give unto my son Edward Lewis and negro man
 named Shiver and one horse called Samsen.
 I give unto my son William Lewis one negro girl
 named Fanny I give unto my son George Lewis one

negro boy named Dennis I give unto my son Philip
