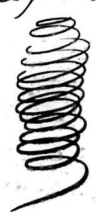


George Storall of the County of Franklin and State of Tennessee
being in my proper mind and senses and knowing and knowing that I
must shortly go hence do make this my last will and Testament the last
property which I possess. I divide in the following manner my estate
my son Joseph I give a negro girl named Lucy unto my son Henry
I give a negro boy named Thomas (and negro girl named Maria
unto my son John I give a negro boy named Rubin and a negro
girl named Eliza unto my daughter Sally I give a negro boy
named Reeph unto my daughter Jane I give a negro girl named
Rodey unto my son Elijah I give I give a negro boy named
John unto my son Eluska I give a negro boy named Abraham
unto my daughter Polly I give a negro girl named Abby
unto my daughter Nancy I give a negro girl named Esther the
half value of my negro I leave to my beloved wife Nancy Storall
during her natural life the value of my negroes which I
leave to my wife are Peter, Horner, Shill, Phellis James, Nelson
James, Robert, and ~~Thomas~~ and after the death of my wife they
with their increase except Horner one are to be equally divided
among my nine children in such manner as my Executors here-
after named may think best. It is well that Horner after the death
of my wife be free so far as she is not to be to any person as a
slave neither to go off and leave my children but to choose
some one of them as a servant and to live with my children
as a herding from hence to come as she may think proper the
plantation on which I now live I leave to my beloved wife
Nancy Storall during her natural life and after her death the above
named plantation including the first mill together with my
land lying in the forks of the River I give to my sons Henry
and Eluska. Henry to have two fifths and Eluska to have three fifths
and unto my son Eluska two thirds of the residue of my land
including the saw mill having sold the other third to William
Larkin. It is my will that my beloved wife Nancy Storall
retain in her possession as much of the household furniture
farming utensils live stock & crop as she may think proper for
her comfort and maintenance the balance to be divided as my
Executors hereafter named may think proper to this my last
will and Testament. I do appoint my beloved wife Nancy Storall
my son Henry Storall & Eluska Storall and my friend Joseph
A. Hunt in my Executions having gone through with my
property. It is my will that my children will be contented
with the portion that I have given them. I make no other
bequest and seal this 29th day of July AD 1820.
