hundred & thirty-three dollars which I request put at interest unto
the said Josiah Hill at all arrive to the age of twenty-one years
or if he should die before he arrives to that age I request the
money to remain and be equally divided between my Brothers
and Sisters "Secondly" I give and bequeath unto two little
daughters of Percy Kinney named Rebecca & Elizabeth three
hundred dollars which I wish my Executors to contribute to
them in their raising as their Executors may require and
if one of the two girls should die I wish the other to receive
the three hundred dollars and if both should die before they
are grown "I wish the money to remain and be equally
divided between my Brothers and Sisters Thirdly I give and
bequeath unto my brother John P. Kinney my wearing apparel
and silver watch "Fourthly I give and bequeath unto my sister
Moriah Bonner one hundred dollars "Fifthly I give and bequeath
unto my wife Mary Ann Bonner my clothes and all my
household furniture & everything that I own I give and bequeath unto
beloved Mother Nancy Kinney one hundred dollars During
her life and at her death to be equally divided between my
brothers and sisters then I request the remainder of my property
and division of what I have always owned to be changed into money
as soon as practicable and of the paying all debts and expenses
the balance of the proceeds to be equally divided between
my brothers and sisters the names are as follows Mahinda
Bonner Samuel I humbly ask Moriah Bonner Mahinda Logan
John P. Kinney Mahola Davis as witnesses whereof I have here-
unto set my hand and affixed my seal this twenty-
fourth day of January 1838 I have signed right hundred and thirty-
eight "I subscribed with these words before signed three hundred
