I Hannah Collins do make & publish this as my last will and testament hereby revoking and making void all other wills by me at any time made

First I direct that my funeral expenses and all my debts be paid as soon after my death as possible out of any moneys that I may be possessed of or may first come into the hands of my executor

Secondly I bequeath to the heirs of James & Sarah Robins one hundred dollars to be equally divided between them. I wish my executor to pay over the hundred dollars as before mentioned to Dr. Ruth that is living in Texas and him to distribute it out equally between the said heirs as they need it

Thirdly I wish Elizabeth Woods to have my bed Steads and all the clothing that I have on hands also the bed ticks the feathers belongs to the estate and also my chest that I have. I also give to aunt Elizabeth Woods my pony that I worked in my buggy the Buggy I wish to go to Mrs Jane Buckley.

Fourthly I wish my executors to pay over Elijah Turner, Fifty Dollars out of any moneys that I have if there should be any I wish my large table spoons to be given to sister Sarah Walder in Missouri the small ones to Brother

Fifthly I wish my executor to pay over to Mrs ^{Clarke} ~~Clarke~~ ^{Clarke} Kellaspie twenty five dollars she has been so kind to wait on me. I wish my executor to pay over to the negro man Oren that I owned twenty dollars Louisa fifteen dollars Caroline ten dollars, Bank a negro girl six dollars, Sarah four dollars, Carolines little boy four dollars, Susan that belongs to Aaron Thompson five dollars. I wish Andrew Woods and Wiley E. Woods to have one hundred dollars each, the remainder of my estate what ever it may be to be divided between my brothers and sisters in Missouri. If any of them should be dead I wish their part to go to their children if any if not to be divided between them that is living.

And lastly I hereby constitute Wiley E. Woods to be my executor of this my last will and testament.
