 County & State of Tennessee one negro boy named Samuel and one
 named Talbot to his proper use and benefit. 4th I give to my
 niece Hannah Ruth Woods also daughter to the aforesaid James Woods
 one negro boy named Albert to his proper use and benefit. 5th
 I bequeath to the heirs of Andrew Woods of the aforesaid County
 whom I raised one negro woman named America with
 the Exception of the first child said negro woman may raise
 which said excepted child is to go to settle the property of Andrew
 Woods son of Andrew Woods aforesaid 6th I bequeath to my niece
 Hannah Woods daughter of the aforesaid Andrew Woods my money
 and saddle and bridle to her proper use 7th I bequeath to my
 nephew James Woods for his great attention to me since my
 husband's death all the money and other property I may possess
 at my death. 8th I constitute and appoint James Woods & William
 Woods Executors to this my last will and Testament. In testimony
 whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the 25th day of March
 one thousand eight hundred and thirty three
 by and sealed & delivered in the presence of 3 ^{his} Hannah Woods ^{most} (Seal)
 Richard C. Arnett Abigail Woods.

 Arnett and also that a commission issue to take the deposition
 of the said Abigail Gibbons for the purpose of proving the
