

I Henry Robman of the County of Franklin and State of Tennessee being of sound mind and memory acknowledging in view the uncertainty of life to make and ordain this my last Will and Testament and hereby revoking all other Wills by me heretofore made: 1st I direct to my wife Elizabeth Robman and her heirs forever the tract of land with the appurtenances on which I now live lying in the County of Franklin State of Tennessee containing about one hundred and fifteen acres. 2d I give and bequeath to my wife Elizabeth Robman her Executors administrators and assigns forever all my personal goods chattels hereby intending to bequeath to her all my personal estate of every kind and description. That I do hereby appoint and nominate and appoint the said Elizabeth Robman the Executor of this my last Will and Testament. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the Eighth day of September A.D. Eighteen Hundred and Thirty (1830)

First It is my Will that all my just debts be paid and in the furtherance of that object I authorize and empower my Executor in Alabama as hereafter appointed to sell all my perishable property in Alabama of every description that is my horse and only excepted what I wish reserved
