

In the name of God Amen I Isaac McCrory of Transchar County and State of Tennessee being in our body and of sound mind and perfect memory do hereby certify that I have for the purpose to make and publish this my last will and Testament in manner & form following that is to say first, I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife a certain negro man named Harry many also thirty five acres of land on the Murfreesboro River State of Tennessee one feather bed and furniture belonging to the same one Communion bed and one cow and calf one sow and pigs one ewe and lamb also if she wishes to stay on the farm she is to have the privilege of living in the house & the cultivation of the north part of the land I say thirty five acres for her and my three youngest children should she not bring any of her own children if she does she is destitute of the privilege and if she does not reside on the land she is to have some of the proceeds To my son Elijah I have given one negro named Jim horse saddle and bridle one cow and calf one sow and pigs one ewe and lamb which is what I give and bequeath to him of my effects. To my son Howard I have given one horse saddle and bridle one cow and calf one sow and pigs one ewe and lamb &c. together having already paid debts of his contracting to the amount of the negro which I understood for his distribution share. To my daughter Jane B. and her husband James B. I have already given a horse saddle and bridle one cow and calf one sow and pigs one ewe and lamb &c. together with debts I have paid for them to the amount of three hundred dollars or upward To my son David McCrory I have already given a negro boy named Henry horse saddle and bridle one cow and calf one sow and pigs one ewe and lamb the amount due him from my effects &c. also bed and furniture. To my son Michael McCrory I have given him a negro boy named Thomas one horse saddle and bridle one cow and calf one sow and pigs one ewe and lamb bed and furniture &c. To my daughter Mary Arnold and her husband William Arnold I have given one negro girl named Dorsey one horse saddle and bridle one cow and calf one bed and furniture &c. To my son Isaac McCrory I give my negro man Cook one horse saddle and bridle one cow and calf one sow and pigs one ewe and lamb one bed and furniture. To my son William McCrory I give one of two negroes which is due me from my father's Estate in the State of Georgia and in case the negroes should not be had or obtained The Executor of my Estate to purchase a negro boy worth three hundred dollars to pay over to my son William also one horse saddle and bridle one cow and calf one sow and pigs one ewe and lamb one bed with furniture &c. To my daughter Francis McCrory I give one of the two negroes which is due my son.

my fathers estate in Georgia if had or obtained if not the Executor of
my estate to give them a negro girl at the price of three hundred
dollars and pay over to her I also give her one horse saddle and
saddle one cow and calf one hen and pig one ewe I leave one
bed with furniture &c. I also give to my three youngest
children the privilege to reside in my house and to have the benefit
of fifty acres of cleared land adjoining the house also they are to
share with my wife two thousand pounds of pork and so much
corn from my crop as will support them &c. my black man Dick
and his wife Nancy are not to be sold but are to remain
on the farm to work to support my three youngest children
until they become of legal age that they are to receive choice from
among my children a master who it is to take them at
value who is to pay to each Legatee its distributive share
of the nominal value of the two negroes &c. The balance of my
property I wish sold and the proceeds appropriated to the
liquidation of my great debts after the liquidation of the claim
which I have bequeathed to my three youngest children and the
liquidation of my great debts I wish my lands and other effects to be
equally divided amongst all my children &c. And lastly as to all the
rest residue and remainder of my personal estate goods and chattels
of what kind and nature soever I give and bequeath to all my
children to be equally distributed amongst them all I appoint
my two sons David and Elijah McHenry my Executors of this
my last Will and Testament hereby providing all former wills
by me made in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
and seal this the 27th day of August AD 1830
