I Isaac Child of White County and State of Tennessee being of sound mind and Perfect memory but of an infirm and frail Constitution and knowing that it is appointed for me to die do now to prevent confusion after my decease dispose of my worldly goods in the following manner first of all I order that all of my lawful debts and funeral expenses be paid out of my estate by my Executors hereinafter named Secondly I order that the land I have on and all the improvements thereon and all my other estate be and continue to be in possession of my dear Wife Margaret Child for her use and the Childrens use that shall be with her for to school cloth and keep them and that without any restriction of shewes no more than if I were living Third I order that my Wife Margaret Child shall have one third of all my Estate and one man or horse to be valued at one hundred dollars and one cow & calf to be valued at twelve dollars & all the household furniture and her saddle all these to be besides her third during her life I leave to my Daughter James Johnston five shillings to be paid out of my estate I leave my son John Child five shillings to be paid out of my Estate. I leave my son Mathew five shillings to be paid out of my Estate It is my desire that my son Robert Child shall have the land that I bought from John Stanton in Shelby County joining land to Isaac Horman & others if it is not severed my son Robert Child shall have

recourse on the heirs I have &c. my Daughter Susan
 thirteen five shillings to be paid out of my Estate. I have
 to my Daughter Margaret Deane one cow and calf to be
 paid out of my estate. I have to my son Isaac Miller
 five shillings to be paid out of my estate. I likewise
 mention that there may be a sale in aid when my
 son James Robinson shall be when he arrives at the age of
 twenty one. By my Executors after the sale of my Estate.
 Lastly I appoint constitute & make my wife Margaret Miller
 and William Metcalf my Executors. To carry this my last
 will and Testament into effect in witness our hands and seals
 this first day of December One thousand Eight hundred & seven
