

I, Jacob Vansandt Sr. of the County of Franklin and State of Tennessee being of sound mind and recollection do make and ordain this to be last Will and Testament." First I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Catherine Vansandt during her natural life the following property to wit: Twelve acres of drained land including the houses whereon I now live and as much timber as will be necessary for her use of any part of the tract on which I now live, also as much of my household furniture as she may wish to keep for her own use, also a certain negro girl, named Sally, and a negro boy, named Peter, two cows and calves and one horse. Secondly I give unto my son, Abraham Vansant, to him, his heirs, and assigns forever a negro girl, named Nancy, which I raised and her increase, also a negro man, named Allen, also said Nancy's child, named Hamilton, and a negro boy, named Luke. Thirdly, I give unto my son Jacob Vansant in trust for the benefit and use of my daughter, Elizabeth Kurkindal and her children forever the negro girl, named Sally aforesaid, and her increase, at my wife's death, also one negro boy named John, and fifty acres of land to be laid off in a Square and to be taken in the South West Corner of the tract on which I now live and at the death of my daughter, Elizabeth, shall be conveyed to my son, Jacob, to his children, to them and their heirs forever. Fourthly I give unto my son, Isaac Vansant to him, his heirs, and assigns forever a negro woman by the name of, Will Nancy, and her child named Angettina, and a negro boy, named Lewis. Fifthly I give unto the children of my daughter, Mary Black-urn which she has or may have to their, and their heirs forever a negro woman, named Winney, which my daughter has now in possession and her increase also, a negro girl, named Milley, a negro boy, named Harry, and a negro woman known by the name of, Old Ann. Sixthly I give unto my son Jacob Vansant to him, his heirs, and assigns forever a negro woman, named Fanny and her children named Lucy and Tom and her increase, also a negro boy, named Peter, at the death of my wife and one hundred acres of land being the half of the tract on which I now live, to be laid off in the East Side adjoining the land of my son Jacob which he now lives on, also adjoining the land of Fanny Gillaspie and Richard Callaway. Seventhly I give unto my son Abraham, my son Jacob in trust for the benefit and use of my daughter Elizabeth and her children, my son Isaac, my daughter Mary and her children, and my son Jacob all my real and personal Estate of every description to be equally divided, except that which is above named, and Willed lastly I appoint my son Abraham Vansant and Jacob Vansant Executors of this my last will and Testament hereby revoking all former Wills given under my hand and Seal this 9th October, 1815.
