In the name of God Amen I James Saedlin of the County of Franklin
and State of Tennessee living in a weak and languishing state of body
but perfect in mind and memory and calling to mind that God
hath appointed for all men alike to die do in this my last will
recommend my soul to God who gave it me and my body to the
grave to be interred in a decent and Christian like manner
at the discretion of my friends and after discharging of my funeral
expenses and all my just debts which is paid and there of but
magnitude all of which at no my desire may be principally
paid and that without delay the residue of my estate both
real and personal I give and bequeath in the following manner
My beloved wife Elizabeth Saedlin I give and bequeath
all of my stock of cornels all of my household and kitchen furniture
and Edy during her natural life and the plantation I now live on with
all the appurtenances thereto belonging unto the farming tools &
the negro woman Edy I leave at the discretion of my wife to dispose
of her as she may then proper shooed she think proper to see her at
her my will the proceeds of the sale shall be my Grand son
James Saedlin and at the decease of my wife all the property
that may be remaining or otherwise left with all debts that
may be owing and the land I now live on containing one hundred
and twenty three and a half acre I give and bequeath to the before
mentioned Grand son James Saedlin son of William Saedlin
who I have from infancy raised from a infant at the same
time I request that that before mentioned James may strictly
attend to the plantation and in particular to my wife Weston
William Saedlin I leave the plantation he is to bequeath to his
wife Mary Saedlin during her life the old Survey containing 170
acres with an addition by entry of 100 acres of the said Survey
paying to his brother John Saedlin should he ever call on him
one hundred dollars for the one hundred acre entry to be used
to raise the said hundred dollars if the said entry will sell
for that if not the amount it being sold at the decease of the
said William Weston it is my desire the land may be sold and the
proceeds equally divided among his children ~~But they excepted who~~
is now in my family and who I have not thought of until in this

place to her it is my especial request that out of my home estate
she shall have a good feather bed and furniture a horse & cart
of the value of Fifty dollars also a cow and calf and decent clothing
and a decent Saddle and to be under the direction of my wife so long
as she may live or morry the same to be adjudged by my
Executors who may be hereafter named or such persons as may
be chosen by the said James & Betsy should they not amicably agree
to further Reguarit the said John David his one hundred dollars to
come out of my home estate if she should ever call for it
Revoking all former Wills and Testaments and constituting this my
last & hereby appoint James Bryant James T Phillips Joshua
Arnold my Executors to this my last Will to see that the same
is executed to the intent and meaning " in Testimony where-
