 Lastly I do hereby nominate and appoint Willie High Town
 son of my wife my executor in the business whereof I do
 this writing at my will and set my hand and seal to the same
 this 27th day of January 1846. In witness whereof I have done

 Franklin County Then the last will & Testament of Solomon
 Bauser was produced in open Court by the
 Executor therein named whereupon came William Bauser
 & Thomas L Bauser subscribing witnesses thereto who being
 first duly sworn depose and say that they were acquainted
 with Solomon Bauser the Testator and that he was of sound
 mind and disposing memory at the time of making the same
 and they signed the same as witnesses at his request
 and in his presence. Thereupon it is ordered by the Court
 that is said here be recorded thatness my hand at office
 this 6th day of April 1846

I James Knight of the County of Franklin & State of Tennessee
 being of sound and disposing mind do make and publish this
 my last will and Testament hereby revoking all former wills
 by me at any time made I testify & demand that all my
 just debts be paid this being done. Secondly I give and
 bequeath to my Brother John Knight all my lands which
 are as follows one hundred and thirty & one be given
 to me by my father which he is claiming the lands of
 John H Knight on the West side of the line containing two hundred
 on the North the land formerly owned by Col James Lewis
 on the East and B B Knight on the South one half of
 the tract thereon we now live containing two hundred
 acres one hundred acres of the same is now making
 in all two hundred and thirty acres 3rd I also give and
 bequeath to my said Brother John Knight all my slaves

that was bequeathed to me by my Father (test it)
 Jacob Bes and Judy H^d & also give such bequeath to my
 said Brother John Knight all my household and kitchen
 furniture stock of all kind the crop now made and
 by then and all my gathered all of the above named property
 cloth etc at my personal it is my will and desire that my
 said Brother John Knight shall have and enjoy during
 his natural life & 5th it is my will and desire that at
 the decease of my said Brother John Knight all of my
 lands and other property before devised to my said Brother
 John Knight with its inclose be equally divided
 unto three lots of equal value between my two Brothers
 Bro Bnd Benjamin B Knight and John A Thomas and the
 same the lots being of equal value as testimony each
 to the possession held and enjoyed by them and their heirs
 respectively absolutely and forever & I hereby nominate
 and appoint my said Brother John Knight Executor of this
 my last will and Testament. In testimony whereof I have
 hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 4th day of
 September AD 1846
