Sartain is to have the colt, all the above named property I give to my wife durin her life then to be sold and equally divided except the land I give to my sons: Secondly I do also give and bequeath to my daughter Peggy McGowan one hundred dollars to be paid by my Executors as I may hereafter direct him and my Colt I do also give and bequeath to my daughter Polly King one hundred dollars to be paid by my Executor as I may hereafter direct. I do give and bequeath to my daughter Betsy Wiseman fifty dollars to be paid by my Executor as I may direct. I do give and bequeath to my daughter Nancy Crockett fifty dollars to be paid by my Executor as I may direct. I give and bequeath to my two sons George W. Sartain and Thomas J. Sartain all my tract of land lying East of my land to have from my death and the balance of my land they are to have at the death of their mother. I give and bequeath unto my son John Sartain a demand I have ainst Saul Colquitt unto my son James R. Sartain a demand that I hold ainst such Kelso for one hundred and fifty five gallons of Whiskey. I give and bequeath unto my son Samuel D. Sartain a demand that I hold ainst Davis Necks for twenty dollars and fifty cents. Also a judgment that I have against Martin French for upward of twenty dollars. and lastly I devise all the property not specified in this Will to be sold upon a credit of twelve months all debts which are due to me to be collected and all my just debts paid and if there be an overplus after complying with this Will then that overplus is to be equally divided amongst all my children.
