of the Natural Love and affection which I have and due for
my beloved daughter Virginia Victoria Pocahontas Adverses
of said County and State aforesaid have and by these presents do
give grant and convey unto & to her and her heirs and assigns
State in trust for the said Virginia Victoria Pocahontas
Adverses for and during her natural life and at her death to
her children for ever to wit a my so named Charles
about 10 years old a my so named Kate about 10 years old
a my so named man named Alex about 3 years old a my so named
married Alex about 26 years old also the tract of land on
which I live in Franklin County Tennessee containing about
Two hundred and fifty acres lying the tract of land
purchased by me of John Smith also all my horses
cattle sheep hogs farming utensils household & kitchen
furniture " To have and to hold said negroes land & other
property in trust for the uses & purposes aforesaid that
it is said for the sole and separate use and benefit of my
daughter Virginia Victoria Pocahontas Adverses during
her natural life and at her death to go to her children for
ever " The said James B. Adverses have granted their educate
my daughter liberally by day sending her to the best schools
and the University " I do retain all the above named & conveyed
property for my own use during my natural life " In
witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and
seal this the 27th day of October A.D. 1852
