 of God Amen" I James Woods of County & State above written  
 do make this my last will and Testament 1<sup>st</sup> It is my will that  
 my just debts be paid honorably and that none of my slaves  
 be sold 2<sup>nd</sup> I give my beloved wife my land & all  
 property that I may have at my death and my descendants of  
 me this life During her life so unable has it given my  
 children sufficient hundred dollars worth of property as they  
 come of age or marry and that each values the hundred dollars  
 as my wife to share what I have given my other children that  
 are married 3<sup>rd</sup> I give my mother during her life Reckoned

upon known by me or any other for use and benefit & whereas  
 my Son Joel Woods is dead and having given him one thousand  
 and thirty five dollars in property & a low price as charged on  
 my book and he having left one child and he having a  
 considerable sum of money left me still that his heirs get no  
 further division of my estate & that he has his wife  
 married my beloved daughter Betsy and I have given her property  
 as charged on my book at a low price to the amount of  
 three hundred dollars and given him a stock worth two  
 hundred dollars more its my will that he get no more until  
 all the children gets as much as he has got and after my death  
 and my wife there be an equal division amongst my children  
 to them as for athen Gibbons I married my beloved Daugh to aleged  
 and having given them property as charged on my book at a low  
 price to the amount of One Thousand and fifty four dollars &  
 I leave it descretionary with my wife whether she gives his  
 widow any more or not until an equal division takes place  
 after our deaths & there as I have given hundred and fifty  
 dollars charged on my book to my son John Woods I leave  
 it descretionary with Betsy whether she gives him any  
 more or not until an equal division takes place after  
 our deaths & its my will that the negroes given my son  
 Andrew Woods and my daughter Anna and Ruth Woods left them  
 Ruth Woods be salved to them at a low price whatever  
 they marry or be come of age as they were given them for the  
 great attention I paid to them during his widow took so  
 that those negro boys they may have only one equal division  
 of my estate by & my wife and myself should both die before  
 her & her children she desired such as had not got a bed  
 give them all household furniture it is my will that  
 they get five hundred dollars a piece more than what  
 are married and received them first according to this will.  
 It is my will that my wife Betsy be Executrix of this will  
 that she be not required to give security to the court  
 in testimony whereof I herein do sign on this my last will  
 and testament this day and date above written.

 were to acquire via the provisions of my Will. Item  
 my Will is that all my negroes except Peter and Lucy be  
 placed upon my Glades field tract of land to live and  
 occupy the same for twenty years under the direction  
 and control of my Executor bearing annually of the profits  
 of their labor to the use of my estate in such manner as  
 my Executor may deem fit & reasonable & shall direct with  
 the advice and consent of my representatives hereafter to be  
 mentioned and at the end of the said twenty years all of  
 said negroes & their children to be hereafter soon are to  
 be freed and are to have the said tract of land absolutely  
 as their property should the Laws of the Country permit  
 this provision of my Will to take effect it is desired the  
 Laws will permit them to be free & remain in the country  
 then my Will is that my Executor continue to man a  
 and supply them as before provided that they are to have  
 the entire profits of their labor except so much as my  
 Executor may be entitled to as compensation for his trouble  
 & for the payment of their taxes & the taxes of the land which  
 amount is to be designated by my representative or a  
 majority of them then my Will is that my negro man Peter  
 be hired out to work by this trade job him by a man of  
 my choice the proceeds of his hire to go into my Estate but  
 at the end of said twenty years my Will is he be subject  
 to all the benefits & to be conferred on my other negroes  
 also direct that come to task to him Peter to hirer
