

I Jane of Dine Haddon of the State of Tennessee and County of Franklin do make and publish this my last Will and Testament respecting my worldly Goods " Having read all skills lay me at any time previous to this ~~will~~ 1st after my death I will that my body be decently buried and that my Executor pay my funeral expenses out of any money that I may have upon hand at my death or any that may first come into his hands 2nd I will that all my lands lying in DeWitt County Tennessee be sold by my Executor at Public or private sale and upon such terms as he may think best for the best interest of the heirs interested in my Estate 3rd I will that all my debts be paid out of the proceeds of the sale of my lands 4th I will that whatever amount of money may be remaining in my Executor's hands from the sale of my lands be expended by him for land for my Grandson Andrew R. Bogle and this when after June 5th I will that my Gray horse my Saddle and one Bed. Bedstead and furniture be sold at Public or private sale by my Executor and the proceeds of such sale to be paid to my Grandson A. R. Bogle 6th I will one Bed. Bedstead and furniture to my Grandson A. R. Bogle " I will to James Bogle Sheriff of DeWitt County all the remainder of my household and furniture of to my Grandson A. R. Bogle leaves the articles aforesaid expended to him 8th I will my entire interest in the estate of Andrew Bogle deceased who died in the State of Alabama and County of Dallas to my Son in Law Hugh Bogle 9th I will two thirds of all the claims that I have against the Government for property taken and destroyed by the Army in the late Rebellion in the United States to Hugh Bogle and one third of the above named claims I will to my Grandson A. R. Bogle " I also constitute and appoint my Son in Law Hugh Bogle my true and lawful Executor to carry out this my last Will and Testament " In Witness Whereof I have this day set my hand and seal May the 23rd day 1874
