Brasfield of the County of Franklin State of Tennessee being aware of the frailty of human life & desiring my own conscience to be satisfied of the justness of this final & disposing of my life do therefore make and give public & declared to be my last Will & Testament that is to say first after all my lawful debts are paid I discharge the residue of my estate both real & personal I give & bequeath to my beloved wife Elizabeth Brasfield during her natural life or widowhood & at her death or marriage the property that may be left I desire to be divided equally between my children above & below alive & also between my beloved wife Elizabeth Brasfield to have charge of my daughter Fannie that I bore by my first wife & that she shall have full control over her until she marries or arrives to the age of twenty one years & in case I make a mistake I will support Fannie & her & her husband & her children to this my last Will & Testament without the necessity of seeing any property they may have but privately I do wish my wife & some term to be substituted my name & I affirm my soul the 10th day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & fifty five
