Franklin County for my last will and Testament have given to my
beloved wife Mary all my personal ~~estate~~ real
estate to have and to hold from the claim or demand of any other
person persons claim or claims only one higher which I give my
daughter Lizzy the rest to be for my wife for the use and purpose
of raising her children to hold the same during life or widowhood &
after paying all my just debts and at death to be divided among
the same to be equally divided among at my surviving
children or any that shall be born of my wife within 6 months
after the death of the last and the division to be equal after Johnson
Kelly having already received 100 42 dollars the rest to have
in prop. portion before he gets any more in witness I have
set my hand and affixed my seal this 20th day of December
1830

Klipper Ralea B Rainer & Edmund Russell & Peter S. Dechord all
of the County of Franklin and State of Tennessee one held and jointly
bound unto Mallis Estlin Chairman of the Court of pleas and
quarter session for Franklin County and State of Tennessee
before said in the sum of five hundred to which payments
shall & truly to be made we bind ourselves our heirs Executors
and Administrators jointly severally and jointly by these presents
sealed with our seals and date this 7th day of March 1831 the
condition of the above obligation is such that a negro man
Orange hath this day exhibited to the Court of pleas & quarter
session for Franklin County his petition to attain his free will
Now therefore if the said negro man Orange does not become
chargeable to the County of Franklin then the above obligation to
be void otherwise to remain in full force & effect

of fifty five & they also being residents of this State for more
than twenty or thirty years of said County therefore pray your
Worship that said slave be set free and be entitled to all
the privilege & immunities that other free people of color
are in this State & as in duty bound will ever pray.

I Edward Luck of the County of Franklin and State of Tennessee
being in sound mind do make and ordain the following as
my last will and Testament (viz) I will and bequeath to my
wife Anna Luck during her life time or widowhood
all my tract of land whereon I now live north of the new
lump running from the old or main land to the Bailing fork
and on the spring also all on the East side of the old or main
land including the improvements thereon also the following
negro Slaves viz. Louis Henry George and her two young
children Angeline and Jacob Phelia Penn and Eliza Del Paul
all my house hold and kitchen furniture a Gray mare
and a chestnut sorrel mare a chestnut sorrel horse and a
chestnut sorrel mare my stock of cattle hogs and sheep
one yoke of Oxen known as the largest and farming utensils
including a wagon known as the new one the above I give
to give my two youngest children reasonable schooling
viz. Lucy & Betsey I will and bequeath unto my sons
William Martin Luck and John Luck as follows viz. that
part of the tract of land whereon I now live south of the
new land and West of the old land including the saw
and grist mills and all the land on the West side of the
Bailing fork being all not included in the bequest
to my wife & negro and three yoke of Oxen and that the
youngest chestnut sorrel horse also to William Martin
that the Smith Shop and tools I also will and bequeath
to my daughter Rebecca two negro slaves Silas and
Dinah to my daughter Mary Ann Freeman two negro Slaves
Diana and Adeline to my daughter Lucy Green two neg-
ro Slaves Washington and Cornet to my daughter Elizabeth
Marshall two negro Slaves Austin and Francis and I further
will and bequeath unto my wife Anna thirty colts
not specified in the foregoing list and any thing else I
may be possessed of at the time of my decease with the
exception of grain or timber that may be in the mill and she
is to give my daughter Rebecca & Mary Ann each a house worth
