 alone named. Seventhly I hereby appoint my wife Executrix
 and my son Henry Higgins Executor of this my last will and
 Testament and do not require either of them to give security
 for the faithful performance of the trust herein imposed on
 them. I further desire that my Executrix and Executor
 run out and make Benjamin Dickard asked to the price of
 land belonging to me not included in North & R. Motion
 filed for witnesses whereof I have heretofore set my hand
 and affixed my seal this 18th day of May 1857

 and State of Tennessee (Shutters) do hereby declare that my last will and
 Testament hereby revoking and annulling and all former Wills by
 me, at any time heretofore made and first I declare that my
 body be discreetly ~~buried~~ at in said County in a manner
 suitable to my condition in life and as to such worldly
 estate as it hath pleased God to entrust me with I dispose
 of the same as follows First I direct that all my debts and
 funeral expenses be as soon after my decease as possible out
 of any money I may be possessed of or may first come into the

lands of my Executors from any portion of my estate either real or personal and I give and bequeath to my trusty and well beloved wife Susannah the plantation on which I live with all the property both personal and perishable during her life time & thence that my trusty and well beloved son Washington take my farming tools and attend to the business of the farm I further give and bequeath to my son Washington and Andrew J Long the tract of land they live on valued at five hundred dollars and I also give and bequeath to my son James Long the tract of land he lives on valued at three hundred dollars and I give and bequeath to my youngest son John and William the tract of land I now live on after the death of my much beloved wife to be divided length ways for the accommodation of said sons valued at six hundred dollars after the perishable property that I bequeathed to my wife Susannah that Vicky and Rebecca & Catherine Morgan and Malinda shall as they marry or become of age receive a horse worth sixty dollars and a bed and bed clothes and also that my sons John and William when they become of age or marry shall have a horse and a piece worth fifty dollars a bed and bed clothes. I do further will that at the death of my wife Susannah that all the perishable property be sold and that Anna and Susannah and Sidney Rebecca Catherine Morgan and Malinda shall receive of the proceeds of the sale so as to make their portions equal with the boys and if there should be of the proceeds of the sale over and above that the balance be equally divided amongst all the heirs so that all shall have a proportionate part. I want further understood that all my ready money shall be to be disposed of among my trusty and well beloved wife & so thereby make and am and appoint my well beloved sons Washington and Andrew & Long Executors of this my last will and Testament. In witness whereof I the said John Long Testator to this my last will written on one sheet of paper this twenty fifth day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty seven signed sealed and published in the presence of four who have seals included the presence of the Testator and of a brother Alist H. G. Guinn H. Gibson
