 the year of our Lord 1812 and of the American Independence the
 36th. I have given of my following viz I do give and bequeath
 after me and my wife's decease to my son Samuel Robin^{son}
 the land wherein I now live I also give to Elmina Robin^{son}
 one Negro boy named James and one horse Saddle and Saddle
 one feather bed and furniture and after all my just debts
 is paid then the balance of the property to rest and remain
 in the hands of Elizabeth my wife during of her life and then
 all of my estate real and personal goods and chattels to me
 belonging at this date & either by note bond or book account
 shall be truly and justly divided in an equal manner
 between my true and faithful children any other will or
 instrument of writing to the contrary is hereby null & void
 I acknowledge this to be my last will and Testament this
 day and date above mentioned signed sealed and delivered
 in presence of us

 property to be divided among my children when my
 wife shall see proper so to do I also constitute and appoint
 my wife Doabel Adams my whole sole Executor in this my
 last will and Testament January 2nd 1813

 Benjamin Majors an acting Justice of the Peace for said County
 and made oath that the within was the words of David Adams
 here said and also they believe this to be his last will and Testament
 also that they believe the said Adams to be in his senses at
 the said time
