The Will of John Sanders

In the name of God Amen, I John Sanders of Franklin
County Ten do make and declare this my last will and
Testament in manner & form following, I do give and
devise to Theloy Sanders my tract of land on which I
now reside containing twenty five acres more or less
lying in district No 4 adjoining the lands of Amos Alcorn
& Benjamin Franklin. I do give and devise to my Son
& to hold to my Son Theloy Sanders his heirs & assigns
forever I also give & devise all of my stock of horses
consisting of one gray mare & two sorrel mares & one
cock to my Son Theloy Sanders, I also give & devise all my
stock of hogs & cattle except one Airedale one yearling
of pork I give to my Son Theloy Sanders to have & to hold
forever, I also certify that I have no claim to the
crop of wheat & corn raised on my land this year
I also give & devise to my daughter Elizabeth Stanton one
land warrant for right of acres of land issued the 23^d of
June 1856 No 36612 to have & to hold forever as sole portion
of my estate. I also will all of my property not otherwise

disposed of to be said for the benefit of my other children I will
 Patsy Ogilvie Patsy Ogilvie Nancy J. Hall the lovely child of
 Alida B. Wallace I receive her portion of my estate John Sanders
 & I. Clorissa J. Jones consisting of one wagon & one horse & one
 wagon one cow & farming utensils household and kitchen furniture
 also three notes of cash, namely one \$500 note one on
 the Blue bond one on R. B. Smith after paying all of the sale of
 the above named property my just debts & with the proceeds
 to be divided equally among the above named children to
 wit Patsy Ogilvie Patsy Ogilvie Nancy J. Hall the lovely
 child of Alida B. Wallace her sister John Sanders Jr. &
 Clorissa J. Jones for them to have & to hold as their portion
 of my estate forever & also appoint John Sanders my executor
