my sum of expenses and all my just debts be paid  
as soon after my death as possible out of any money I  
that I may leave possession of or may have left  
into the hands of my Executors Dr. Wm. D. Rice and  
begin with to my son Jacob Taylor the tract of land I  
purchased from Robert Thompson being one hundred  
acres more or less it being the same tract of land Jacob  
Taylor sold to Isaac Taylor & himself & begin with to my  
son Isaac Taylor one hundred acres of land to be cut  
off my house tract adjoining the above named tract of  
land purchased from the said Jacob Taylor by the  
said Isaac Taylor & himself & begin with Elizabeth  
Herman a negro girl named Mandie a slave which is to be  
in the place of slavery that was recorded to her the above  
named property us to have nothing to do with the distribution  
of the balance of my estate, fifthly I give and bequeath my  
wife Sarah the house plantation during her lifetime one  
meadow has & also a negro girl named Lucy a slave also an  
old negro woman named Hannah a slave Hannah is to be  
free & live with any of my children she wishes to live  
with after the death of my wife Sarah also a negro man  
named Ben a slave also a negro boy named Tom a slave  
sixthly I give and bequeath to my Grand Son George Washington  
Sibley a negro girl named Fanny a slave <sup>and</sup> her increase  
if there should be any to go into his possession at my wife  
Sarah death and John H Taylor to a it as his heir or deader child  
if the said George Washington should die Fanny is to go to him  
if my estate provided he has no heirs Sibley & Rice and  
bequeath to my Grand Son John Taylor a negro boy named  
Admiral a slave to go into his possession at my death  
Eighthly I give and bequeath to my Grand Son John Sibley Herman  
son of my daughter Elizabeth Herman a boy named Paddle  
a slave who wills his possession at the death of my wife

 one bed and furniture some hogs in all worth five  
 hundred ~~Dollars~~ <sup>Twenty</sup> dollars that being all I intended said  
 money is to be out of my estate, 2<sup>d</sup> having heretofore given  
 to my son Coleman three negroes named Lurell & Lewis  
 and Martha one horse saddle & Bridle one cow and Calf one  
 bed and furniture some hogs in all worth nine hundred  
 and ~~Twenty~~ <sup>Twenty</sup> Dollars, 4<sup>th</sup> Having given to my beloved daughter  
 happy they negroes named Almy Nancy & Henry one house  
 saddle & Bridle one cow and Calf some hogs four bed  
 furniture in all worth fifty ~~Two~~ <sup>One</sup> hundred Dollars and shall  
 make no further provisions for her but 5<sup>th</sup> Having heretofore  
 given to my son Tom ~~Two~~ <sup>One</sup> negro a girl named Anna  
 a boy named Thomas one house saddle & Bridle one cow  
 Calf some hogs one bed and furniture in all worth three  
 hundred and ~~Twenty~~ <sup>Twenty</sup> Dollars of it I give to my son Jesse one  
 negro girl named Lissie one horse saddle & Bridle one bed  
 and furniture one cow and Calf some hogs my estimation  
 of the worth of the property I give to Jesse is Seven hundred  
 and thirty six dollars. 6<sup>th</sup> I give to my daughter Pleasant  
 two negroes a girl named Maria a boy named Fred one  
 horse saddle and Bridle one cow and Calf one bed and furniture  
 some hogs in all worth nine hundred ~~Twenty~~ <sup>Twenty</sup> Dollars  
 but my will is before she receive is and described property which  
 shall be conveyed to a trustee for the sole benefit of her
