

I Thomas Hudspeth of the County of Transylvania and State of Georgia being now sick being possessed at my Brother Robert Hudspeth in the County of Transylvania and State of Tennessee and being of sound mind and memory do make and ordain this to be my last will and Testament First I give and bequeath unto my Brother Robert Hudspeth one Negro man named Jacob now in the State of Georgia also one negro man named Andrew now in possession of Mother at her decease also one negro woman named Elizabeth and her increase also all the money arising from debts due me after my just debts are paid Secondly I request that my Executors herein after named will sell the residue of my Estate consisting of Slaves, Smith Tools, Horses, Cattle and household furniture and that the amount arising from the Sales of the said property be equally divided between my brother Robert Hudspeth my Sister Mary Lawrence and my Brother Richard Hudspeth Lastly I appoint my Brother Robert Hudspeth Executor of this my last will and Testament hereby revoking all former wills. I John Woods of Transylvania County and State of Tennessee being through infinite mercy more than ordinary health and of perfect sound and composed mind do make this my last will and Testament in manner and form following: I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Abigail Woods the tract of land I now have on containing one hundred and thirty four acres with all the improvements thereto attached during her natural life I bequeath and it is my will that my beloved wife Abigail Woods hold during her natural life my negro man J. J. and his wife Seltor and their son named Richardson and all my household and kitchen furniture and farming Tools with all of my stock of horses (cattle sheep and all sort of hogs as belong to me now on said farm I now bequeath this my will and desire that my two sons in law Charles Duncan and James McComb and their wives Mary and Susan and Susan a McComb and their children have no further division of my Estate I have given to these said negroes and their of an equal value that my Estate will make with the rest of my children I fear that it is my will and desire that my three negroes named Aaron J. J. and

had willed ~~and~~ equally divided between my son James Stoods and
 my son in law William Erdoes who married my beloved daughter
 Sary Stoods now deceased and their heirs and their are Logybridge
 and Rebecca Logybridge and their heirs to be divided by lot and
 if any difference of value be between said negroes each shall
 pay to the other so as to make all equal. I am further thereof
 know have on hand a crop of cotton and pounds due for money
 and some money on hand and desire to use those funds during
 my life and at my death if there should be on hand any
 money or other articles not otherwise devised it is my
 will and desire after my just debts is paid that my
 beloved wife Abigail Stoods have one fourth part of any
 account that may be on hand and the balance of said
 funds be equally divided between my son James Stoods
 and William Erdoes who married my beloved daughter Sary
 Stoods now deceased and their heirs and William Logybridge and
 his wife Rebecca Logybridge and their heirs. I am further
 it is my will and desire that all the property given to my
 beloved wife Abigail Stoods at her death be equally
 divided between my son James Stoods and William Erdoes
 who married my beloved daughter Sary Stoods now
 deceased and their heirs and William Logybridge and Rebecca
 Logybridge and his wife and their heirs and it is my will that
 if my said wife shall belong to my son James Stoods at
 their value and it is my will that Richmond belong to
 William Logybridge and Rebecca his wife and their heirs at
 his value and the balance of the property be so divided as
 to make all equal feeling myself resigned to the will of
 God. I bore this my last will and Testament this twentieth
 day of April One thousand Eight hundred and fifteen
