 is to be sold at the highest bidder and the money arising
 from that sale to be divided in manner following that
 is to be equally divided between John Thomas James Thomas
 Putney Bakerworth Son at Shavers Fork at young Henry Baker
 I do make and ordain constitute and appoint my son John Thomas
 and James Young my Executors of this my last will
 and Testament and I do hereby revoke disannul all other
 wills before made ratifying and confirming this and
 no other to be my last will and Testament in witness
 whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this
 Twenty third of April and in the year of our Lord one
 thousand eight hundred and Eleven signed sealed
